The Spring Show of May 4-5, chaired by Karen Murry and Judy Kramer, was a big success. This was our first year doing a two-day weekend show instead of two consecutive Saturdays. Initial evaluations indicate that the artists appreciate the new format.

On the evening of May 13, we had our second general meeting of the year, organized by Chuck Boxwell. For many years we have hosted the staff from Artisan Art Supplies in Santa Fe. They come to introduce us to new products and give out generous samples. I spoke to a fabric artist who attended, and she was so inspired by the presentation she wants to start painting.

The general meeting included a sandwich buffet, providing time for members to get acquainted before the actual program. Thanks to Roxanne Turner and Tama Dumlao, our Social Committee Co-chairs, for facilitating this part of the program.

EACA had a display table at the ECIA's annual Earth Day celebration. I was joined by Karen Murry and Rhea Lowell to greet visitors and share information about the EACA.

This year's Studio Tour may well be the largest in our history. At this point we have 112 artists participating in 69 studios. The required meetings for participants began in May and continue in June, so registered tour participants, must pay close attention to the schedule for meetings and required documents.

A new addition to the Studio Tour this year is that we will have a mobile link on the website that people can upload to their phones with photos and directions for the tour. Special thanks to Pat Rasmussen and Debbie Parke for your organizational skills to keep this impressive team moving forward together.

Photographers John Wylie, Ashton Thornhill and Sam Elkind are showing work in the exhibit entitled *Visual Journeys: Three Santa Fe Photographers*. The exhibit will run for the month of June at the Nocturne 818 Gallery (818 Camino Sierra Vista, Santa Fe). There are receptions on June 1 and 28, 5:00 to 7:00 PM. During the rest of the month, the exhibit is open Wednesdays through Saturdays.

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Watercolorist Patsy Welch is teaching "<u>Introduction to Watercolor Landscapes</u>," July 21-27 at Ghost Ranch. Students need no prior experience. Patsy has a BFA in painting. She studied both painting and fresco at the

Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Paris, France. Her award-winning paintings have been exhibited nationally and internationally. She has taught watercolor for over 30 years, with classes in many locations.

Vista Grande Library Exhibits

This June, artist Adrian Skiles will be the featured 3-D and 2-D artist at the Vista Grande Public Library. Skiles applies a unique processing to his photographic images lending them brilliant luminescence and strong color saturation that brings culminates in a richer and more dynamic viewing experience, work that the *Santa Fe Reporter* once described as a gorgeous marriage of "the singular moment, capturing the prowess of photography with a strange fractal-esque style of abstraction."

The exhibit runs from June 1 to June 29 at the Vista Grande Public Library. There will be a public reception at the library for the artist on Saturday, June 1, from 1:00 - 3:00 pm.

In July, the Art Quilt and Surface Design Group of the Northern New Mexico Quilt Guild (NNMQG) takes the 2-D and 3-D exhibit spaces. These quilts are for hanging as wall art, but quilts can also be 3-D. The 30-member group has been in existence for nearly ten years.

A public reception for the quilt artists will be held at the library on July 6, from 1:00 - 3:00 pm.

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Artists Residencies and Grant Opportunities:

<u>Willowtail Artist Residency</u> in Mancos, CO offers residencies of one to three weeks. Opportunities available include partially funded or fully funded residencies. Rolling application period. Entry fee: \$25.00.

Ghost Ranch in Abiquiu announces its <u>Estudio Corazon Artist in Residence Program</u>. Participants in the program will be housed in a group of seven casitas on the Ghost Ranch grounds and have access to the community dining facilities. Casitas have both living space and a studio. There are rolling application dates and a participation fee structure that ranges from \$1,760 to \$4,640, depending on the length and season of stay. Entry fee: \$25.00.

The <u>Headlands Residency Program</u> (Sausalito, CA) offers residencies of four to ten weeks, in which artists have access to studios, housing, and chef-prepared meals in a dynamic community of artists. Rolling entry deadline. Entry fees: \$35.00 to \$45.00.

<u>Innovate Artist Grants</u>: Distributed each quarter is a grant of \$1,800 for "one Visual Artist and one Photographer." Quarterly entry deadline. Entry fee: \$35.00.

<u>Centrum Artists-in-Residence Program</u> (Port Townsend, WA) invites applications from artists of all backgrounds. The goal is to provide artists of an opportunity "to relax, focus and/or reinvent their practice, as needed." Entry deadline: June 30, 2024. No fee for entry; some participation fees may apply.
