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and Member-at-Large Rhea Lowell have been working through them and made recommendations for a few changes. The updated By-Laws need to be approved by the EACA members, so you will soon be receiving an email with the revisions and an online ballot. Approval requires a majority of those members voting.

The General Meeting held on February 21 was very well-attended. The program on how technology, including AI, can be used in art, was organized and presented by Chuck Boxwell and Harn Soper. The slide show and talk by Harn was expertly done and generated much discussion. The event was enriched by the dinner that preceded the presentation. Social Co-Chair Roxanne Turner organized a meal of sandwiches, veggies, and cookies from Sprouts.

The next General Meeting will take place on Monday, May 13, in the Railroad Room at the Community Center. The presentation will be by Artisans Art Supply. This is the return of a pre-Covid tradition in which they come with examples and demos of new products and usually a goodie bag of give-away items for those attending.

Membership Chair Molly Elkind reports that we currently have 140 members. She organized a tea for new members on the afternoon of March 22 from 3:00 to 5:00 in the Living Room at the Community Center. This was an opportunity for new members to gather, get to know one another, and meet some of our board members.

Our Spring Show will be arriving on Saturday and Sunday, May 4 and 5, 10:00 to 4:00, at the Community Center. Co-Chairs Karen Murry and Judy Kramer have created a two-day weekend show, instead of the two consecutive Saturdays that we've had in the past. This should make the process much easier on the artists. In addition to fabulous art, this show will feature a food truck from Fusion Taco.

The Art Book Group continues to meet monthly. Check out the related article elsewhere in this newsletter.

The Studio Tour is set this year for September 21 and 22, and planning has begun in full force. In February Co-Chairs Pat Rasmussen and Debbie Parke hosted a meeting of the planning team, consisting of 28 people who oversee the many aspects of the Tour. Watch for the notification for online applications for the Tour soon.

The Board is exploring two possible projects to support our goals of supporting artists and engaging with the community.

- The first is the possibility of using the EACA website to help our members with their online sales. Ideas range from actually becoming a "marketplace," to simply providing links to artists' current online sales platforms. While there is enthusiasm for the concept among the Board members, we realized quickly that there is no one on the Board with the time to add this to their responsibilities. General wisdom teaches that online sales require skill and ongoing monitoring. If this is something you would be interested in pursuing, please contact me (EACAPresident@gmail.com) and let me know.
- The second project is to sponsor an art supplies swap. The goal would be for members to clear out unneeded supplies, to make them available to others for little or no cost. Social Co-Chair Roxanne Turner and Member-at-Large Elizabeth Freijs are working on this as a possible summer event. If you have ideas and/or time to help with this, please contact either Roxanne or Elizabeth at their contact listed in the Board roster at the end of this newsletter.

Thanks to all those who volunteer your time and energy to make the EACA a vital resource for our artists and the Eldorado community.

#### 2024 Studio Tour

Initial meetings of the organizing team for the 2024 Studio Tour are under way, with 28 members refining the 2024 plan for the many EACA artists expected to participate in the September 21-22 event.

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For participants, on-line registration will run from April 5-26, with an additional week of late registration (April 27-May 3 at an additional \$50). Artist planning and organization meetings will begin in the coming weeks. All participants will have volunteer assignments, each of which is tremendously important to carrying off this event. Volunteers make this massive undertaking successful.

Newer participants in the Studio Tour are encouraged to team up with other artists to share studio space. By doing so, both artists will benefit from increased visitor traffic. If you don't know of other artists who might want to share space, the application process will have a way to request a shared studio. But grouping of artists is a proven means of increasing the number of visitors.

## General Meetings

The first 2024 General Meeting, held February 21 in the ECIA Railroad Room, was a well-attended and successful event. Nearly 40 members attended for a light dinner and a presentation about how new technologies might be used to enhance our own artistic process. After President Evie Gauthier's welcome and EACA announcements, Shop Talk's Harn Sooper presented "Technology and the Arts," a brief overview of digital technology for your creative tool kit and how artificial intelligence (AI) might help. This was followed by a discussion led by VP Chuck Boxwell. Points considered included how we all use, or are considering use of digital software and technologies in our art. It was an illuminating presentation and lively discussion which enriched our artistic community.

Looking into the second quarter, save the date for EACA's second General Meeting of 2024 on May 13<sup>th</sup>. At this meeting, Artisan Santa Fe, Santa Fe's pre-eminent art supply store, will make a presentation showcasing some of their new products and provide some samples to our membership. Artisan Santa Fe has been a supporter of EACA for nearly 20 years making this type of presentation almost annually. It has always been a highlight of EACA's meeting presentations and one not to be missed. Look for a formal email event invitation soon.

#### **EACA Member News**

Jeweler Mekkah Gordon had a recent piece, a silver cuff bracelet named "<u>under the sea</u>," accepted into the online exhibit of the Society of North American Goldsmiths.

One of photographer Adrian Skiles' "Image Shifting" works has been selected for the <u>15<sup>th</sup> Annual New Mexico</u>

<u>Photographic Art Show</u>. This is "New Mexico's Best Color Photography Exhibition," where over 100 color photography works will be on display through April 16 at the Fine Arts Building of the New Mexico Expo in Albuquerque. Admission is free.

Photographer Sam Elkind has a selection of new images featured in the March/April issue of *Shadow and Light Magazine*, an online photography journal. These images are from his current project, "Assembling the View."

Watercolorist Patsy Welch is teaching "<u>Introduction to Watercolor Landscapes</u>," July 21-27 at Ghost Ranch. Students need no prior experience. Patsy has a BFA in painting. She studied both painting and fresco at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Paris, France. Her award-winning paintings have been exhibited nationally and internationally. She has taught watercolor for over 30 years, with classes in many locations.

### Vista Grande Library Exhibits

In April, the Vista Grande Public Library will continue to exhibit photography by Ashton Thornhill. April's 3-D artist, Janice St. Marie, has made jewelry from age 12. "I have never stopped making jewelry," she laughs. "In fact, I have some beads from so long ago that they could now be considered vintage!"

In May, the library will host Linda Armentrout and Arlin Ginsburg. Armentrout produces oil paintings on canvas, using cold wax, oil pastels, or oil sticks to communicate her deepened feelings about transitions since moving to New Mexico. Upon moving to Eldorado, her subject matter shifted to reflect the local landscape and wildlife.

The 3-D exhibit space during May will show Arlin Ginsburg's colorful hand-carved, painted birds, turtles, and frogs—a craft he has perfected for decades, and which recently has been influenced by New Mexico's cultures and landscapes.

<u>The Vista Grande Public Library</u> Art Exhibits Coordinator, Monica Emrich continues to encourage local artists to exhibit their work. Either 2-D or 3-D art will be considered for exhibition. More details about the library's exhibiting process can be found at this <u>link</u>.
